Team spirit was high and we wish to thank Head Coach Duncan and all of the parents and supporters.




PINK SHIRT DAY 2022

BLUES – BEST FOOT FORWARD CAMPAIGN

Members of The Blues and their coaching team recently came to RI to run some training and promote their Best Foot Forward campaign.

Best Foot Forward is a programme to gift recycled boots to youngsters who might otherwise miss out on playing sport.

Since the program began in 2017 more than 1000 pairs of boots have ben gifted to young people in our region thanks to generous donations from our rugby community and the public.

One in five New Zealand children live in poverty and cost is the biggest barrier to children playing sport. We don't want youngsters to miss out on the joys of team sport because of financial reasons.

We are collecting pre-loved rugby and football boots on behalf of The Blues who then clean them up and pass them on to those in need. We have already collected over 3 bins full of boots and received 150 tickets to the recent Blues Vs Reds game. We're still collecting though and would love to take your donations of used boots in good condition – any size, any brand!

A design for each bin type was laser cut out of 3mm MDF and painted in easily identifiable colours. Students were taught








how to paint, drill and rivet these designs to the new bin lids.

Some students also completed family trees in French as part of their studies about family and their own family genealogy.



ESOL - A YEAR 7 FOCUS

Tucked away at the back of the library is our ESOL room. Around 45 students receive small group lessons to enrich their proficiency with our English language. It's a busy place with opportunities to focus on listening, speaking, writing and reading. Many activities are based on the Year 7 and Year 8 Social Studies or Science topics to provide support for their classroom lessons.





Last term Year 7's focused on speaking English and developing a growth mindset. We created puppets to help with this, and set up our own ESOL radio station where we conducted interviews.

This Term we are supporting the Year 7 Science unit "From Surviving to Thriving" by creating our own habitat for cottage garden seeds. These were sown in egg shells donated by food tech students and are flourishing with the aid of regular (and not so regular!) watering, sunlight and 'glasshouses' made of plastic bags.

After five busy weeks of school the Chess Club resumed this term. Students of Year 7 and 8 classes attend the club every Monday to Thursday after lunch eating. The sessions have been full so far!
