FINAL DECISION YEAR 7 CAMP

No doubt many of you have seen the impact the recent storm has had on Camp Adair. The camp staff have indicated they are confident they will be operational by the time we are due to arrive. Before any final decision is made, myself and a few staff will visit the camp in person to check for safety and readiness.

As a school, we have committed to making a final decision regarding whether or not the camp will go ahead on Monday the 27th March. This decision will be communicated via our website and email on the 27th.

RECENT SCHOOL LOCKDOWN

As most of you will be aware we recently experienced a reported incident in our local community that resulted in a school lockdown. Our internal processes as outlined in our Emergency Plan worked very well and all students and staff were secure in less than three minutes from the initial police directive to place the school in lockdown.

On this occasion, we were given no details by the police other than to place the school in lockdown. Throughout the

period of the lockdown we were given no further information other than what we could glean from the media. As such we remained in lockdown as outlined in our procedures for a little over an hour. Upon receiving the all clear classes were notified to return to business as usual.

As you can imagine communication during a lockdown is an important consideration for students, staff, families and the wider community. We have a notification system built into our school website. On this occasion, we immediately posted the alert message on our homepage and once the lockdown had ceased we left a message on the site for the remainder of the day to outline the events of the day.

By relying on this single point of contact we can turn our attention to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of your children as these events can certainly be a source of worry and fear. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you and the staff for remaining calm throughout this recent lockdown. Feedback from our students has been very positive and they felt very safe and calm throughout this event. Coincidentally we do have a review booked this month with our consultants for all our emergency procedures and to train staff who have joined the school since the last review.

In relation to this a number of people have asked about a school notification system like those used by many other schools. We are currently looking into a school based app

which would support greater communication in addition to providing other relevant and timely information. This may be an extension of the parent portal or a standalone system. We will update you on this matter as decisions are made.
